
If selected, will you be available and committed to participate in the main six components of the programme as listed below:

- First Training/Workshop, (one week) 13-20 February 2015 in Vienna, Austria: the first component of the programme will be one-week, of a hybrid between a workshop and training. Its main objectives include: to provide the participating fellows with an orientation about KIFP; group community building and intensive capacity-building in IRD and leadership including an orientation for the online course (KOCID).
- Participate in the Online Course (February April 2015): the participants will join KAICIID interreligious dialogue online course (KOCID). The online course includes different topics that are selected and designed by experts in the field. KOCID consists of 12 modules and accredited by several universities
- Second Training/Workshop, (one week) 4 11 May 2015 (location in Asia): during this week, the fellows will receive further training on designing interreligious dialogue programmes and facilitation. By merging the knowledge they learned from the online course and the skills they gained from the first training, the participants will work on developing initiatives, which they will implement individually at their institutions and/or home communities (or in smaller groups as partnerships among them might emerge). Each KAICIID Fellow will receive a small grant to implement his/her initiative).
- Implementing Interreligious Dialogue Initiatives (May October 2015): The initiatives that were developed during the previous component will take place during this period. The initiatives will vary according to each participant's creativity and the needs of his/her local institution or community. The implementation of such initiatives will not only provide an opportunity for the participants to practice their skills but also will help in disseminating the knowledge they gained. This component will also provide an opportunity for evaluating the fellows' progress and achievements.
- Monitoring and Evaluation & Sustainable Replicability (1 September 15 October 2015): During this period, the
 participants will focus on learning more about monitoring and evaluation skills through a series of online
 sessions so as to apply these newly acquired skills to their own previous activities. They will also learn how to
 report and write a paper about such activities, for publication on the KAICIID web-site, as part of its Peace
 Mapping Project. This component will also require the participants to design a sustainable replicable model for
 their activity based on their integrated learning throughout their KIFP experience (between 15 October until the
 final meeting end of November, the participants will be working on writing their final reports and preparing for
 their initiatives presentations).
- Fellows Final Evaluation, Sharing and Training of New In-coming KIFP Class (26 November 9 December 2015):

 During this component the participants will come back to KAICIID for two weeks. The first week will be concentrated on in-depth debriefing and final evaluation of their KAICIID Fellows experience. They will remain for a second week during which they will welcome the new in-coming KAICIID Fellows class through sharing their year-long experience. They will also practice the Training of Trainers dimension of their KIFP final experience with the new in-coming participants.
