COURSE DESCRIPTION

Evaluation Quizzes/True and False Questions. Comprehension of course content will be assessed through brief, mandatory quizzes at the end of the module. The quizzes contain a variety of question styles including multiple choice, true or false, matching, etc. Participants can attempt each evaluation quiz an unlimited number of times, without incurring penalties toward the final score.

Case Studies. These exercises provide participants with space to express opinions, share experiences and put acquired knowledge into practice. Some activities will redirect students to the forum, so they can exchange views and lessons learned with other course participants.

Certification. A Certificate of Completion signed by the Secretary General of KAICIID will be issued to participants who achieve a minimum total score of 70% for the entire course and who have diligently attended and successfully completed the online course.

Building on DKH's popular 8 module course, busy professionals can now select the individual modules they need most and learn on-the-go! Administered through a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) platform, this short course takes approximately one week to complete and can be taken anywhere, anytime, at your own pace, from your phone or computer.
